





My child can't read yet? How will he/she cope?

What should my child know?

I'm worried my child won't eat at recess. He'll/She'll go hungry! My child takes so long to complete her work. Will he/she fall behind?



What should my child know?

- Alphabet
- Express basic needs in English
- Ask and answer simple questions
- Count up to 10
- Basic understanding of numbers

- There is sufficient time for children to pick up what they need to know academically
- Help children to develop a joy for learning
- Encourage them to forge friendships
- Promote their wonder about the world around them

Children need time to adapt to learning in

- Bigger classroom
- More classmates, yet only one teacher to a class
- Longer school hours



My child can't read yet? How will he/she cope?

- An advantage but not a must
- Never too late to start getting your child interested in books!!!

- Take your child to the library
- Expose him/her to various picture books
- Read together
- Have great parent-child bonding sessions through bedtime storytelling
- Point out signs and words around him/her
 In school, students will be
 - Taught to blend letter sounds to form words
 - Exposed to various text types and genres of books
- Read to on a regular basis
- Engaged in learning experiences in which they learn new vocabulary



My child takes so long to complete his/her work. Will he/she fall behind?

It could mean 2 things:

- Lack of time-keeping has become a bad habit
- Unsure of how to go about the work

In school,

Time assigned for a piece of work

At home,

- Parents can do the same with small tasks or everyday activities
- Be specific about how much time they should spend on a task
- Use a timer
- Children pick up time management at a different pace
- With help, time management can be improved



I'm worried my child won't eat at recess. He'll/She'll go hungry!

- Teachers will be standing by to help
- P4 buddies are assigned to each student for the first 2 weeks
- Extended recess time for the first week

When eating out, allow your child to

- Order food
- Make payment, handle money

Important to note

 Encourage and remind your child to eat first before heading to the bookshop or playing with his/her friends





- Respond to issues by providing ideas or solutions


5W1H

6. Holistic Assessment

- Focus on building greater confidence and nurturing a stronger intrinsic motivation to learn so as to develop your child's potential
- No semestral examinations and weighted assessments at P1
- Use of appropriate assessment modes to provide useful information to support students' learning and development of the whole child



Performance-based Tasks



Show understanding of Mathematical concepts



Group work and presentation



Show and Tell



Written Work



How do we assess your child's progress in learning?

- Through checkpoints (e.g. class discussions, in-class work, homework, show and tell and bite-sized tests) to gather information about students' learning
- Use of qualitative descriptors to report students' learning progress for all subjects in the Holistic Development Profile (HDP) at the end of Semester 1 and Semester 2.
 - > 3 levels of qualitative descriptors






Reporting of P1 Students' Learning Progress in HDP






English Strategies

Learning Goals for Mother Tongue Languages (MTL) (P1-P2)

- 1. To nurture active Learners and proficient users of the MTL Language
- 2. Develop foundational language and literacy skills
- 3. Appreciate the local ethnic culture

Listen with understanding, Speak with confidence

- Students will be given opportunities to hear the language being used in a variety of contexts, such as in conversations, rhymes, songs and reading of storybooks in MTL.
- Language <u>learning through play and interaction tasks</u>.
- Students will be provided with the <u>platforms to express themselves</u> in MTL e.g., Show-and-Tell, performing tasks, speech and drama

Reading – Enjoy MTL activities


Students will be encouraged to <u>cultivate good</u> <u>reading habits</u> and explore more MTL storybooks and appropriate reading materials in class through

- Weekly reading activities in class
- Reading Programme & Reading Magazines
- Reading tasks for P1 and P2 students

Writing

Students will <u>learn to write words</u>, <u>phrases and simple sentence(s)</u> about daily life with guidance.

E.g., curriculum writing assessment, creative writing lessons etc.



Cultural Awareness & Appreciation

- Students will <u>celebrate diversity</u> and be given opportunities to <u>learn about values and</u> <u>traditions</u> and <u>participate in culturally-related</u> activities
- e.g., Celebration of festivals in school and Mother Tongue Fortnight held annually

- Class roles (e.g. Class monitors, Subject leaders, Eco stewards)
- Non-academic awards (e.g. Young Olympian)
- Termly Model Student awards (based on the 4 school values)
- LD awards (based on the 5 learning dispositions)

9. Parents' Support for Child

How You Can Support Your Child

- Check Parents Gateway, Student Handbook, Homework file and SLS regularly
- Monitor your child's daily work (especially corrections to be done, help your child to understand the need to learn from mistakes)
- Inculcate in your child the habit of reading
- Encourage your child to revise his/her work
- Develop in your child a sense of responsibility for his/her actions through equipping them with self-management skills:
 - Organising items in the school bag
- Time management
 - Drafting and adhering to a study timetable
 - Completing homework stated in the Student Handbook



9. Parents' Support for Child

Academic Resilience

- Recognise that there are topics/subjects which are more challenging
- Try different ways to overcome this difficulty
- When your child overcomes the difficulty, share the satisfaction of the "Ah-Ha" moment
- Praise your child "You did it!"





• focus on your child's learning journey, rather than compare them to others.

 encourage Joy of Learning by not over-emphasising academic performance



Positive Thoughts

Natural Curiosity that should be roused and nurtured

- a) Work in Partnership with the school.
- b) Asking the right questions

Encourage your child to look out for interesting things and changes in their surroundings and ask questions about what they observe. When walking around the neighbourhood, you can ask "Do you wonder why rainbows appear after rain?", "What do you think you can do with empty bottles?", "What did you learn today?"

Keep these questions and conversations going as your child enters Primary 1 and beyond. Your child will be astounding you with their answers, or even asking you challenging questions.

Focus on building a strong foundation

It is a journey, not a sprint

Skills such as social skill set needs to be built before academic dispositions

Setting up routines

What can parents do

Creating Excitement - Go through the school website or its social media pages with your child. Look at the photos of the events and activities to get them excited about going to school, meeting their teachers and making new friends.

Social Skills - At home, role-play different scenarios, for example, how to introduce themselves to their new classmates or raise questions in class.

Routines - Create a daily schedule that includes blocks of time for rest, play, learning and sleep to ease your child into their new routines. Once school starts, you can include blocks of time for completion of homework and the packing of their bags for the next day.

Positivity - Some children may experience anxiety during the first few days of being in a new school

environment, which in turn raises the anxiety level in us parents. This will get better once the child is more comfortable with the new environment and routines and has made new friends.

You can help by discussing and acknowledging their feelings. Children feel more reassured when their parents show a positive attitude towards their new school and learning experience, as well as show trust in the teachers.

Academics


What about the academic aspects?

Have regular conversations with your child about their daily experiences. This helps to build their speaking and listening skills. Spend time reading to or reading with your children to nurture their love for reading and interest in English and Mother Tongue Languages.

You could also engage them in simple numeracy-related activities such as counting objects around the house or comparing the quantity between two sets of objects.
